Mixing it up to lob on the beach

TENNIS coach Paul Mapley is trying to serve up something different for people who love sport on the beach.

Mapley said beach tennis was a hybrid, incorporating elements of tennis, beach volleyball and badminton, but had its own equipment and rules.

The game is played overseas, particularly in Italy, but Mapley said Melbourne was its home in Australia. "You could say we are born on the bayside. We have been piloting the program since December '04," he said.

"We wanted to determine if the game could be played all year round in Melbourne and the only problem

was in relation to the rain."

He said the game could be played by people of all ages, competitively or socially. "We've got 400 people on our database who have taken part, but usually between 25 and 35 participate at each of our sessions."

Mapley was part of the Australian team that finished fifth in the world championships played in Italy last year.
